If we are continuing to sin, not only are we not faithful (Hebrews 10:26), we are not being a very good example to the younger (or older) Christians.

If we are in sin, that also means we are also a bad example to the world. When the world looks at Christians sinning, they see hypocrites. If the world sees Christians as hypocrites, then they will not want to be a part of God's family. Since God wants us to spread the word about Him, then it seems only logical to be like Him, correct? Being

an example is one of the ways of spreading the Gospel (Matthew 28:18-20, Mark 16:14-20). Being in sin also causes problems in the world. For example, like we have discussed in Bible class if your friends pressure you to drink or take drugs, and you give in, you have sinned. And since it is easy to get addicted to that stuff, it can lead to being in sin. This obviously causes a huge split between you and God, as sin always does. But that is not the only split in relationships that sin causes. It causes division in your relationship with your church family and possibly your physical family.

If a Christian is in sin, it is possible to get out of sin before it is too late. If that person keeps working on it, and asks God for forgiveness every time he/she messes up (1 John 1:9), then that Christian will, if he/she keeps improving, get better over time. One thing that helps is having an accountability partner. Accountability

How We Are to Speak

Jesus said, "I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless word they speak, for by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned." (Matt. 12.36-37) One indicator of a righteously trained heart (2 Tim. 3.16-17) is whether a person's speech is pure. It would do the reader well to read the following verses in context to give full understanding of how Jesus wants us to speak.

Speak lovingly. "Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ..." (Eph. 4.15)

Speak truthfully. "Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another." (Eph. 4.25)

Speak gracefully. "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." (Eph. 4.29)

Speak kindly. "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." (Eph. 4.31-32)

Speak thankfully. "Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving." (Eph. 5.4)

Speak knowingly. "Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these

things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience." (Eph. 5.6)

Speak purely. "For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret." (Eph. 5.12)

Speak wisely. "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." (Eph. 5.16)

Speak spiritually. "addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ..." (Eph. 5.18-19)

Speak peacefully. "Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him." (Eph. 6.9)

Speak boldly. "praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak." (Eph. 6.18-20)

If there are any impurities in your speech, train yourself in God's word. BG
