Two Basic Truths

Sometimes we make things too complicated. That's true in life. It's also true when it comes to religion. All the complex questions and issues quickly muddy the waters and make it difficult to understand anything. Sometimes, it is important to just be reminded of the basics. Consider two important simple truths we should always remember...

First, there is a God. We have to always begin with this basic fundamental truth. The Bible begins with this as an accepted fact. "In the beginning God..." (Genesis 1:1). There is no debate about whether or not there is a God. He just is.

There are a lot of people who publicly debate this truth. Some celebrities such as Daniel Radcliffe, Kathy Griffin, Billy Joel, etc. Others are scholars who make - passionate claims against God. Men like Richard Dawkins, Stephen Hawking, Greg Epstein, and Sam Harris. Their passionate atheism reminds me of the words of Paul when he wrote, "For what

can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse."

(Romans 1:19–20). In other words, look around and see that God is real.

What things can we see that prove the existence of God? We see a world perfectly suited for our existence. Days, nights, seasons, months, and years pass on in precise perfection. Our galaxy, solar system, planet, and moon all work in perfect concert with one another. Our bodies feature the complexities of DNA which serves as a library of blueprints for all cells in the human body.

How did all of that happen? Simple. There was a designer. The Hebrew writer said, ...every house is built by someone... (Hebrews 3:4). Just as every

Job questions God for 36 chapters. Finally, in Job 38 God speaks to Job. But

notice what God focuses on. "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line up on it?" (Job 38:4–5). God's point was simple. Man cannot understand the wonderful mysteries of the world but he can. Because he made it.

Look around and know this simple basic truth. There is a God.

Second, I am not Him. Every one of us must not only accept there is a God but we must also realize we are not God. Too often we put ourselves on the same plain as God. But I'm not Him. I can't design what he designed. I cannot even fully grasp His design at its deepest level. No one can.

Certainly this is a humbling truth. It should be. We need to humble ourselves before the Almighty (James 4:10). We need to learn that the only way to truly experience life at its best is when we accept that God is greater than we are and will provide us the correct path of life (Psalm 16:11).

The next time you think you know how to run your house better than God, remember that there is only one God and you are NOT. Him. The next time you think you can run the Lord's church better than God, - remember that there is only one God and you are NOT Him. The next time you think you have all of the answers to life, remember that there is only one God and you are NOT Him.

The point here is very simple. You and I must submit to God. After God finished questioning Job, Job responds the only way a man can:

Then Job answered the LORD and said: "Behold, I am of small account; what shall I answer you? I lay my hand on my mouth. I have spoken once, and I will not answer twice, but I will proceed no further." (Job 40:3–5).

Job essentially says, "I give up. I surrender. You are God and I am not. I will trust you. Isn't that the only logical response when faced with God's amazing power?

As you go through this week, Satan will challenge you to lean on your own - understanding. He will try to convince you that you know better than God. Reject that temptation. Remember, there is a God and you aren't Him.
